RE: Yearly Fire Inspections



As the Middletown Township business community recovers from the first wave of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Fire & Emergency Management Department is poised to assist businesses to re-open to get our economy rolling again. Most importantly, we want to see businesses re-open in a fire-safe manner. We understand the significant economic and emotional impact COVID-19 has had on our community and are committed to doing everything in our power to give our businesses the best chance at survival.

To that end, for the remainder of 2020, our formal fire inspection program will be paused and shifted to a self-reported safety walk-through program. This should satisfy insurance company requirements for fire safety. There will be no fee from the Township for this process.

Middletown Township will *require* you to provide our office with the following documents – (whichever applies to your business) for the calendar year 2020:

- 1) Fire alarm testing certification.
- 2) Sprinkler system testing certification.
- 3) 90-minute emergency light test certification can be done in-house.
- 4) Show proof your fire extinguishers have had their annual service and tagged.
- 5) Notification to us if key(s) to the Knox-box must be updated.

In addition to the items above, *restaurants* are required to provide the following:

- 1) Show proof that your hood & duct systems have been professionally cleaned & tagged on a semi-annual basis.
- 2) Show proof that your hood suppression systems have had their semi-annual service and tagged as such.

In order to assist you, we have attached a "Preparation Check List" for commonly addressed items we normally find on a routine basis.

Dear Business Owner or Manager,

Listed below is a checklist to help you prepare for your upcoming fire safety inspection. This list is not all-inclusive but it will help you become better prepared. Should you have any questions please contact our office at (215) 750-3812.

Preparation Check List:

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□House numbers are clearly visible from the front – 10 inch.
☐ House numbers or business name is clearly visible on the interior suite door and/or the rear exterior of the exit door.
□Boiler, mechanical, and electrical rooms are to be labeled.
□Exit signs are lit/illuminated at all times.
□ Emergency Lights are working and tested for a period of not
less than 90-minutes. Provide this documentation to the
Township of Middletown Fire & Emergency Management.
□ Doors including fire door(s) - open and close freely.
□Locked doors are unlocked during business hours & posted as such.
□ Combustible materials shall not be within 10' of the building, this includes dumpsters.
☐ House-hold & regular type extension cords shall be replaced with
circuit-protected breaker type power strips.
□ Provide clearance of not less than 30" between all electrical
service equipment and storage.
□ Fire extinguishers need to be serviced within the last year.
The company on the tag of the fire extinguisher can do this.
□ Provide a general housekeeping or cleanup to make sure all areas or
spaces – including storage – are kept neat & tidy.
Fire Alarms Systems:
□Certification of the fire alarm system, local and monitored
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systems need to be certified within the last year. If the system is monitored we suggest that you contact your monitoring company. Provide this documentation to the Township of Middletown Fire & Emergency Management.

<u>Sprinkler Systems:</u>
□Sprinkler systems need to be certified within the last year, the company on the tag can do this, where the sprinkler pipe comes into the building. Provide this documentation to the Township of Middletown Fire & Emergency Management. □Maintain 18" clearance between storage/stock and sprinkler Head(s).
 Kitchens: □The hood must be cleaned on a bi-weekly basis. □The hood and duct must be cleaned professionally and tagged according to the schedule below: o Wood Burning or Other Solid Fuels (Monthly) o High Volume Cooking (Quarterly) o Moderate Volume (Semi-annually) o Low Volume (Annually) □The hood suppression system shall be serviced and tagged
semi-annually. Dryers:
□After every use - lint must be removed from the lint trap & posted as such.
On a yearly basis – have lint removed from the dryer and all exhaust lines.
□Inspect dryer exhaust to make sure it is tightly connected at all junction points and not with sheet metal screws.
Portable Space Heaters: □ Portable space heaters must be plugged directly into an A/C outlet. □ Only space heaters that are UL Listed with tip-over protection are allowed for use within a commercial occupancy.
