Middletown Township: Roads Set for Repaving in 2024 Revealed



Middletown Township's Road Improvement Program is a vital initiative with a goal to pave all Township roads in the community. Worn out and damaged roads pose a safety hazard

to drivers and lead to increased vehicle maintenance costs. It is crucial to maintain road repaying schedules to avoid additional wear and tear, which can make them more expensive to fix and maintain over longer periods of time.

The complete list of Township-owned roads (in whole or part) to be repaved as part of the

2024 Road Improvement Program are as follows:

- Robinwood Drive
- Robin Circle
- Wood Court
- County Lane
- Frankin Road
- South Flowers Mill Road (will be repaved after drainage project is complete)

atmosphere. The following is a list of events to be expected at the games this year:



PennDOT Improvements to Langhorne-Yardley Road Slated to Begin Soon



PennDOT improvements to Langhorne-Yardley Road are set to begin this summer. This project is focused on improvements to two signalized intersections along Langhorne-Yardley Road. Pedestrian safety and stormwater management will be made throughout the entirety of the project.

The following two intersections will be the project focus:

- Bridgetown Pike the existing signalize "Y "-intersection will be replaced by a single-lane roundabout. The traffic signal will be removed for the roundabout to be installed. The roundabout will eliminate the existing skewed angle of intersection.
- Woodbourne Road the northern approach of Woodbourne Road will be reconstructed to improve alignment at the intersection, turn lanes will be constructed on all four approaches, and the traffic signal equipment will be completely replaced.

PennDOT hired contractor James D. Morrissey who is present in the area preparing for the project. Residents can expect road construction to begin on the project near the Bridgetown Pike side in early summer. Traffic will be able to flow through the construction zone however, a 60-day closure through the Bridgetown Pike intersection is planned through the project. The date for the closure is to determined and will be advertised on Middletown Township social media. Construction is anticipated to last about two years.

PennDOT is scheduled to present at the Board of Supervisors Meeting on June 11th. For ongoing updates visit PennDOT's project website.

skipped on Monday may put out up to 20 containers, bags, or bundles on Thursday. Residents who typically have Tuesday collection will not be affected.
